



Call to Order

Richard Setty, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 10:55 a.m.

Approval of Minutes

Committee Reports

Examination Committee

- Gary Silverman reported that he contacted NEHA regarding their examination and requested updated statistics on the examination and the pass/fail rate.
- Dr. Silverman informed the Board that the NEHA examination is more expensive than the PES examination.
- Dr. Silverman informed the Board that NEHA reported that, according to NEHA, the examination passage rate has been good. The passing score accepted by NEHA is still 68%, even though the Board requires a 70% passage rate.
- Dr. Silverman informed the Board that once he receives the data from NEHA he will review the statistics to make sure the examination is still a viable option for examination candidates in Ohio.

Executive Secretary Report

- The Executive Secretary informed the Board that things had been busy in the office in preparation for the upcoming renewal and rule filing.
- Ms. Youst stated that she attended several trainings on the mandatory MBE/EDGE programs for state vendors and would be required to attend additional trainings in the coming months to fulfill the requirements of Executive Order 2008-13S.
- The Executive Secretary informed the Board that 43 candidates had taken the PES examination offered by the Board on October 23, 2008.

Assistant Attorney General's Report



4736-12-01 Annual-renewal.

- ~~(A) Those registered shall apply for renewal of registration each year. The date for such application shall be no more than thirty days before, nor thirty days after, the annual expiration date.~~
- ~~(B) Each application for renewal of those registered shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code and evidence that the continuing education requirements as set by the board have been met.~~
- ~~(C) The board, with the approval of the controlling board, may establish a fee in excess of the amount prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code, provided that such fee does not exceed the amount prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code by more than fifty per cent.~~
- ~~(D) During the first year of registration, a registrant may claim toward renewal approved clock hours earned from the date the certificate of registration was approved by the board until the certificate expiration date.~~
- ~~(E) Except for the first annual renewal, those registered must complete the continuing education requirements of the board within the twelve months immediately preceding the certificate expiration date.~~
- ~~(F) Sanitarian in training renewals are limited to four one year periods following expiration of the original certificate of registration except as provided in sections 4736.10 and 4736.15 of the Revised Code.~~
- ~~(G) Assessment of a late fee as provided in division (A)(6) of section 4736.12 of the Revised Code and reinstatement by the board shall apply to the following:~~
- ~~(1) Renewal applications submitted more than thirty days after certificate expiration.~~
 - ~~(2) Renewal applications submitted pursuant to paragraph (A) of this rule that are incomplete more than thirty days after certificate expiration.~~
 - ~~(3) Renewal applications submitted pursuant to paragraph (A) of this rule which include continuing education earned after certificate expiration.~~

4736-12-01

Requirements for Certificate of Registration Renewal.

(A) Registrants shall apply annually for certificate of registration renewal.

(1) Renewals shall be mailed to registrants no later than thirty days prior to the annual expiration date of a registrant's current certificate of registration.

(2) A registration expires by operation of law at the end of the specified one year period, after which reinstatement, in accordance with rule 4736-11-09 of the Administrative Code, by is required. Registrants may not practice environmental health once a certificate of registration expires until it is reinstated by the board.

(3) The following items are required to reinstate a registration during the first thirty days following the expiration of a certificate of registration:

(a) The fee prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code, including the late fee as provided in division (A)(6) of that section:

(b) Proof of at least eighteen hours of board approved continuing education in the twelve months prior to the expiration date of the certificate of registration; and

(c) Completed renewal application and declaration of material assistance form.

(4) The following items are required to reinstate a certificate of registration that has been expired for more than thirty days:

(a) The fee prescribed in rule 4736-11-09 of the Administrative Code:

(b) Proof of at least eighteen hours of board approved continuing education for each year of the certificate of registration was lapsed; and

(c) Completed reinstatement application and declaration of material assistance form.

(B) Each application for renewal shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code and evidence that the registrant met the continuing education requirements as set forth by the board.

(C) The board, with the approval of the controlling board, may establish fees in excess of the amount prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code, provided that such fees do not exceed the amount prescribed in section 4736.12 of the Revised Code by more than fifty percent.

- (D) During the first year of registration, registrants may claim approved continuing education hours earned from the date the certificate of registration was granted by the board until the certificate expiration date when applying for renewal of their certificate of registration.
- (E) Except for the first annual renewal, registrants shall complete the continuing education requirements specified by the board within the twelve months immediately preceding the expiration date of the certification of registration.
- (F) Sanitarian in training renewals are limited to four one year periods following the expiration of the original certificate of registration, except as provided in sections 4736.10 and 4736.15 of the Revised Code.

4736-13-01 **Revocation.**

- (A) The state board of sanitarian registration may deny, refuse to renew, revoke or suspend a certificate of registration in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code for unprofessional conduct, the practice of fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration, dereliction of duty, incompetence in the practice of environmental health science, or for other good and sufficient cause.
- (B) For the purpose of this rule, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not necessarily limited to:
- (1) ~~Falsifying~~ Willfully falsifying any record, report, or other instrument in pursuing the practice of environmental health science as a registrant ~~registered sanitarian~~;
 - (2) ~~Making~~ The making of a material misrepresentation or ~~a false promise(s) or promises~~ through advertisement, sales representatives, agents or otherwise in connection with the practice as a registered sanitarian;
 - (3) ~~Allowing~~ Willfully allowing an unregistered person to use ~~the registrant's~~ registered sanitarian's certificate of registration;
 - (4) ~~Aiding~~ Willfully aiding or abetting another person in the violation of Chapter 4736. of the Revised Code or the rules adopted thereunder;
 - (5) ~~Using~~ The use of fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration;
 - (6) ~~Disregarding~~ Willfully disregarding, allowing, promoting, or advocating the continued violation of any substantive provision of any public health, safety, or environmental health law, rule, regulation, or ordinance of the United States, this state, any county, any township or any municipality for which the registrant ~~registered sanitarian~~ has responsibility or comes within the practice of environmental health science;
 - (7) ~~Conviction~~ The conviction of any felony crime, or any misdemeanor in the course or scope of the practice of environmental health, or any other crime which ~~materially~~ involves misstatements, ~~fraud, or deceit~~, or other dishonest conduct;
 - (8) Accepting compensation, gifts or gratuities designed to enhance the provider's position over that of the position represented by the registered sanitarian.
- (C) Any person who wishes to make a complaint against any person licensed pursuant to this chapter shall submit the complaint in writing to the board within a reasonable time. Each complaint or allegation of a violation received by the board shall be assigned a case number and shall be recorded by the board. The board shall

determine whether the allegations in the complaint are of a sufficiently serious nature to warrant formal disciplinary charges against the licensee pursuant to this section. If the board determines that formal disciplinary charges are warranted, it shall proceed in accordance with the procedures established in Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.


