### Call to Order

Linda Aller, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 11 a.m.

### Approval of Minutes

Gary Silverman moved to approve the January 26, 2011 meeting minutes as submitted. Gene Phillips seconded the motion. The motion carried.

### Committee Reports

The Professional Committee reported that James Adams and Tracy Buchanan will be giving a presentation at the Ohio Environmental Health Association Meeting on Board activities and professional responsibility during the director's forum portion of the meeting.

### Executive Secretary Report

- Ms. Youst informed the Board that she received the Board's recommended budget numbers for the coming biennium and the Board's budget had been cut from the requested \$130,000 approximately \$3,000 for each of the next two years.
  - The Board requested a supplemental \$15,000 for fiscal year 2012 to pay for the mandatory biennial audit conducted by the Auditor of State's office. That supplemental request was included in the Board's funding for fiscal year 2012.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that, at the urging of the Office of Budget and Management, she had proposed a last minute fee increase for registration renewals and the late fee. It is still uncertain at this time if the fee increase will be proposed as part of the budget bill introduced by the Governor.
  - This proposed fee increase is the same language the Board proposed during the last budget cycle, which was not included in the budget bill for fiscal years 2010-2011. The change would increase the renewal fees for sanitarians and sanitarians in training from \$74 to \$80, which is a \$6 annual increase. The late fee for registrants who choose to renew during the first 30 days after renewal would be increased from \$27 to \$50, which is a \$23 increase.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that things over the next biennium would become increasingly tight. It is still unclear at this time what changes will have to be implemented so that the Board stays within its financial allotment.
- The formal written and budgetary reports are attached to the minutes for reference.

Complaint 2008-C-02

- Linda Aller informed the Board that the investigative committee decided that there was not enough evidence presented to re-open this complaint and it would remain closed.

Complaint 2010-C-02

- Linda Aller informed the Board that a hearing in this matter will be scheduled for the May 18, 2011 Board meeting.

Complaint 2011-C-02

**Action:** Laura Kramer Kuns moved to issue a notice of opportunity for hearing to Mary C. Burns for practicing without a registration for the period of August 1, 2011 through January 26, 2011. Richard Setty seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Assistant Attorney General Report**

- Scott Myers discussed due process with the Board. He will forward information regarding due process via email to all the Board members following the meeting.
- Mr. Myers discussed how complaints are reviewed by the Board.
  - All complaints that are received are issued a number and are reviewed by the investigative committee. The review process can take anywhere from one meeting date to several meeting dates depending on the complexity of the complaint and the information that the committee is presented with or must request.
  - The members of the committee present a recommendation to the full Board based on their review of the materials that are submitted with each complaint. If a violation of the Revised or Administrative Codes is found, a recommendation to move forward is made. This typically comes as a motion to issue a notice of opportunity for hearing to the individual in question.
  - Every time a complaint comes before the Board, all Board members are asked to set aside their bias so that they may make a determination on the facts that are presented.

If you wish to practice environmental health in the state of Ohio, you must hold current valid registration as a sanitarian with the Board.
