Call to Order

James Adams, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.

Approval of Minutes

Executive Secretary Report

- Stephanie Youst informed the Board that MaryAnn Macioce tendered her resignation effective July 31, 2013.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that the rules which went before JCARR in April would be effective June 10, 2013.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that she attended a meeting with the Ohio Department of Health regarding minimum data set collection.
 - This was a preliminary meeting and Ms. Youst did not have many details for the Board regarding the exact data that was going to be collected.
 - This data is being collected to predict trends in the health care environment.
 - The Ohio Department of Health will be providing a set of questions for each involved agency to consider making a mandatory part of the renewal application.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that renewal applications for those individuals who expire July 31 were being mailed on May 29, 2013.
- The formal written reports are attached to the minutes for reference.

Assistant Attorney General Report

- Scott Myers had no formal report for the Board.

New Business

Draft Continuing Education Verification Form

- The Board reviewed the draft continuing education verification form and made one revision.
- The form will be posted on the Board website after the revision is made.
- While reviewing the draft form, the Board directed the Executive Secretary to begin returning any old continuing education forms (CE2, CE3, CE4). Effective September 1, 2013 only the revised forms will be accepted by the Board for CE review.

- The Board reviewed comments received by interested parties in concerning rules 4736-11-03 and 4736-1201 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
 - The comments received in regard to both rules deal with the amount of CE required for annual renewal and changing the renewal cycle.
 - The renewal cycle and fees are both specified in the Ohio Revised Code Sections 4736.11 and 4736.12 and would require a statutory change. The Board is not looking to make any statutory changes at this time with regard to the renewal cycle or fees.
 - The Board discussed the 18 hour requirement for those renewing their registration. The Board also discussed the possibility of carrying over hours from one renewal period to the next.
 - The Board reviewed the type of CE that is currently accepted. If they were to lower the amount the field of acceptable coursework would be substantially narrowed and would only include courses and conferences directly related to environmental health.
 - The Board also discussed that both the CE and renewal issues are linked. They discussed looking into making a change to biennial renewal in the future, but until that time did not want to decrease or limit the amount and type of CE required for renewal.
 - The Board also discussed carrying over a limited number of hours from one renewal cycle to the next. Again, since it is the opinion of the Board that renewal and CE are linked, they did not want to entertain the possibility of carrying over hours at this time and will discuss it at a later time.
 - The opinion of the Board is that it has never been easier to obtain CE since there are numerous conferences and various online CE that can be obtained any time in the convenience of one's own home.



Stephanie,

In discussions with other sanitarians we have always wondered why we are required to have so many CEUs each year. Many other professional organizations require fewer annual CEUs than sanitarians. For instance Engineers and Surveyors in Ohio are only required to have 15 per year. As time progresses and the cost burden is transferred more and more to the individual sanitarians to acquire their CEUs I believe that reducing the requirement to 12 hours annually would be a welcomed change. Additionally, my staff and I frequently feel that we are hard pressed to find new and interesting topics to meet our CEU requirements and in many cases are simply putting in our time for our hours. I would suggest that a survey be taken of all sanitarians in Ohio to see how they feel about CEUs.

Teacher licensing is renewed every 4 or 8 years. By having the sanitarian registration renewal annually (OAC 4736-12-01) it increases the cost of registration.

My suggestion is to reduce the cost of registration by changing from a yearly renewal to a renewal every other year, or better yet every 4 years. And a person with a masters in Public Health or Environmental Health renewal could be every 8 years.

Teacher licensing is renewed every 4 or 8 years. By having the sanitarian registration renewal annually (OAC 4736-12-01) it increases the cost of registration.

My suggestion is to reduce the cost of registration by changing from a yearly renewal to a renewal every other year, or better yet every 4 years. And a person with a masters in Public Health or Environmental Health renewal could be every 8 years.

- (C) "Approved training agency" means an accredited educational institution or affiliate, governmental agency, nongovernmental agency, professional society, association, or organization which has approval from the state board of sanitarian registration to offer continuing education.

- (H) "Executive secretary" means the person appointed by the board to carry out the duties provided in rule 4736-6-02 of the Administrative Code.
- (I) "Full-time employment" means filling a full-time position as characterized by one's employer or employers, an accumulation of two thousand eighty hours, or a period of employment with cumulative total hours that are equivalent to the employer or employers full-time position.
- (J) "Inspection" means activities requiring specialized knowledge and skills in the field of environmental health science, performed by an individual required to be registered in accordance with Chapter 4736. of the Revised Code. Such activities shall include but not be limited to examination and evaluation.
- (K) "Practice of environmental health" means that as defined in section 4736.01 of Revised Code.
- (L) "Registered sanitarian" means a person who is registered as a sanitarian in accordance with Chapter 4736. of the Revised Code.
- (M) "Sanitarian" means a person who performs, for compensation, educational, investigational, technical, or administrative duties requiring specialized knowledge and skills in the field of environmental health science.

(5) For other good and sufficient cause.

(B) For the purpose of this rule, unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to:

(2) Making a material misrepresentation or false promise(s) through advertisement, sales representatives, agents or otherwise in connection with the practice as a registered sanitarian;

(3) Allowing an unregistered person to use a registrant's certificate of registration;

(4) Aiding or abetting another person in the violation of Chapter 4736. of the Revised Code or the rules adopted thereunder;

(5) Using fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration;

(6) Disregarding , allowing, promoting, or advocating the continued violation of any substantive provision of any public health, safety, or environmental health law, rule, regulation, or ordinance of the United States, this state, any county, any township or any municipality for which the registrant has responsibility or comes within the practice of environmental health science;

(7) Conviction of any felony , or any misdemeanor in the course or scope of the practice of environmental health, or any other crime which involves misstatements, deceit, or other dishonest conduct;

- (8) Accepting compensation, gifts or gratuities designed to enhance the provider's position over that of the position represented by the registrant.

- (C) Any person who wishes to make a complaint against a registrant pursuant to this chapter shall submit the complaint in writing to the board within a reasonable time.
