





- The Board discussed that Mr. Hettinger was employed and had an employment contract with the Pickaway County General Health District even though he was on furlough and it was his choice to work on the date in question.



Overview of Activities since the July 27, 2011 Meeting


- Reviewed applications for registration and continuing education credit.

This report of the State Board of Sanitarian Registration covers the activities of the Board for Fiscal Year 2011, which runs from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

Mission Statement

The mission of the State Board of Sanitarian Registration is to protect the public health by ensuring that registered sanitarians possess and maintain specialized knowledge and skills in the field of environmental health. This is accomplished by minimum education standards, examination, continuing education requirements, and the investigation of complaints filed with the Board.

Board Organization and Meetings

The State Board of Sanitarian Registration is composed of seven members, including the Director of Health or his designated representative, the Director of the Environmental Protection Agency or his designated representative, and five members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Terms of office are for three years and members are compensated for board meeting expenses.

Of the five members appointed by the Governor, at least one and not more than two must be employees of a general health district; at least one and not more than two must be employees of a city health district; and at least one and not more than two must be employed in private industry. Not more than one member may be employed by a university and not more than one member may be employed by an agency or department of state.

The State Board of Sanitarian Registration conducted six board meetings and four administrative hearings regarding application denial. Board meetings and administrative hearings, which are open to the public, were held at the Vern Riffe Center for Government & the Arts in Columbus.

Application Review

The examination committee reviewed 79 applications for sanitarian in training registration and 75 registrations were issued. Thirty eight applications for registered sanitarian were reviewed and 38 registrations were granted.

Administrative hearings are conducted for all applicants denied registration, regardless of whether the applicant responds to the opportunity for hearing notice. The Board conducted 4 hearings on proposed denials. The Board affirmed the four denials.

The Board reviewed and granted 17 sanitarian-in-training extension requests. Extension requests did not increase from last year. Although the Board has the authority to grant extensions to sanitarians-in-training who furnish sufficient cause for not applying for registered sanitarian registration within three years, **section 4736.15 of the Revised Code limits a sanitarian-in-training from engaging in the practice of environmental health beyond five-years.**

Compliance, Investigation, and Enforcement

Pursuant to section 4736.13 of the Revised Code, the Board may deny, refuse to renew, revoke, or suspend a certificate of registration, following an adjudication hearing held pursuant to Chapter 119 of the Revised Code, for unprofessional conduct, the practice of fraud or deceit in obtaining a certificate of registration, dereliction of duty, incompetence in the practice of environmental health science, or for other good and sufficient cause. The Board can also enter into consent agreements in lieu of adjudication hearings.

Five complaints were received during the fiscal year. The supervising investigative committee member referred three complaints to the Board, one complaint was a Board initiated complaint, and one complaint was dismissed as it was unsubstantiated. At this close of the fiscal year, three complaints were closed, one complaint was still under investigation, and one complaint was waiting for a hearing date.

Continuing Education

Ninety five training agency renewal notices were issued in November 2010. Eighty eight training agencies renewed their status.

The members of the continuing education committee and the executive secretary reviewed 1,861 continuing education requests submitted by the registrants and training agencies, which is a 1% increase over the previous fiscal year.

Finances

The Board is funded by license and application fees deposited into the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Fund (Fund 4K90). This fund consists of application and renewal fees from 27 professional licensing boards. Each board in the fund is required to generate sufficient revenue to meet its own budgeted expenses, and to pay for collective project costs.

An Open Letter to Registered Sanitarians and Sanitarians-in-Training from the State Board of Sanitarian Registration

The semi-annual sanitarian registration renewal period is quickly approaching and here is a question you are probably (and maybe frantically) asking yourself – do I have enough continuing education credits? Do I have enough credits to be legally working as an RS or an SIT? If the answer is “no” or “I don’t know”, you need to find out quickly. One way to do this is to check with the State Board of Sanitarian Registration to determine your current status.

The State Board of Sanitarian Registration (Board) has seen a disturbing increase in the number of sanitarians who, upon renewal of their registration find themselves short of hours. What does this mean? It means an individual with less than eighteen hours of approved continuing education credits cannot legally work in the field of environmental health until he/she has accrued eighteen hours and those hours are approved by the Board at the next regular meeting. At a minimum, this means a two month wait – two months in which you cannot legally conduct the inspections you were hired to do. Taking a minute to refresh the reader’s memory on this topic, Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 4736.15 states, “No person shall engage in, or offer to engage in, the practice of environmental health without being registered in accordance with sections 4736.01 to 4736.16 of the Revised Code”. Furthermore, Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 4736-11-3(A) states, “Registrants must complete eighteen clock hours of approved continuing education courses each year to be eligible to apply for renewal of their certificate”.

If you have read the May 2011 Board meeting minutes you will see that earlier this year, the Board suspended a sanitarian who was lacking CEU’s, took almost six months to correct the problem yet continued to work conducting inspections using the “R.S.” credential. This was a serious situation and was a difficult decision for the Board to make.

So what can you do to avoid a situation like this? There are a few simple steps you can take to help ensure you maintain your “active” status. First, you can always contact Stephanie Youst, the Board Executive Secretary if you have specific questions about the number of hours you have or have questions about a course that has already been submitted and approved.

Secondly, you can also do a few simple things to help ensure your request for CEU credits is approved:

- One of the simplest things you can do is when you submit a request for course approval, make sure the request form is filled out **completely and accurately**. Provide all of the information requested on the form and remember – the more information provided in the request, the better. Based on the quality of the submittals that Board personnel have been reviewing it is fair to say that many of those submitting requests are doing so with a “half-hearted” effort. No submittal is guaranteed to receive approval so each one should be submitted with the seriousness it deserves.
- Additionally, submit all requests for course approvals as far in advance of your renewal date as possible. This should allow time for additional information to be submitted, if needed, in advance of the renewal date.
- Ensure all requests submitted are legible! Typed requests are preferred however if you do submit a handwritten form, please make sure it is neat and legible.
- Attend pre-approved courses to avoid having to request course approval, especially if a registration is close to expiration. A list of pre-approved courses can be found on the RS Board website.

It is the hope of this Board that everyone reading this will take a renewed approach to ensuring you maintain your Registered Sanitarian or Sanitarian-in-Training status. Keep in mind that conducting inspections without an active registration could be a liability for your agency and potentially jeopardize any enforcement action involving work performed by an individual without an active registration. Find a way to remind yourself on a regular basis of the necessity to complete the educational requirements in a timely manner to ensure your license will remain valid – don't let your employer down!

Registered Sanitarian is our professional title and license and carries with it important responsibilities in the field of public health. Properly maintaining that license is relatively easy and it is the hope of this Board that we can inspire the sanitarians in Ohio to conduct themselves in a professional manner.
