## FACT SHEET

### Reforming Ohio's Medical Professional Licensing Board Structure

Since 2011, Ohio has transformed its state-run health care programs to control costs, improve access to better care, and promote smaller, more efficient government. As we strive to improve systems, tear down silos across Ohio's health care structure, and save taxpayer dollars, our medical professional licensing boards are ripe for reform and should be anxious to embrace a better way of doing business.

#### PROBLEMS WITH THE CURRENT SYSTEM

In 2015, the United States Supreme Court ruled<sup>1</sup> the North Carolina Board of Dental Examiners violated federal antitrust laws because members of the state's dental board were active participants in the profession they regulated. Due to this federal ruling and Ohio's current medical professional licensing board structure, our state is vulnerable to costly legal challenges that could jeopardize the licensing and regulation of Ohio's medical professionals.

Beyond this significant legal concern, current licensing and regulatory systems do not strongly align with modern clinical standards and practices. Additionally, barriers in the existing system that separate medical professionals with shared priorities and regulatory policies make it difficult for different boards to consistently address potential professional misconduct. Currently each board is responsible for independently monitoring professional conduct, managing investigations, and determining appropriate penalties should misconduct be discovered. The existing fragmented system prevents two or more boards with a shared licensee from obtaining all pertinent information about a case, potentially allowing bad actors to face different penalties, or no penalties at all, because the system does not promote collaboration across boards with shared professional interests.

Under Governor Kasich's leadership, state government bureaucracy has shrunk to its lowest levels since the 1980s. However, the antiquated structure of the medical licensing board system has been immune to change. Without reforms to the current system, our state is missing valuable opportunities to save taxpayer dollars and operate more efficiently.

#### PROPOSED SOLUTIONS

##### 1. Create a New Level of Oversight to Limit Legal Vulnerabilities

This proposal directly responds to the aforementioned Supreme Court ruling by establishing a third-party review process by the Department of Administrative Services (DAS), which would be triggered when a board action has the potential to violate state or federal antitrust law. The addition of this review process is aimed squarely at shielding boards from potential legal action and specifically designed to prevent delays in important decisions made by boards.

Under the proposal, any action taken by, or on behalf of, a board that could be subject to antitrust laws would be deemed a "reviewable action." In that case, the board may self-refer the action for third-party review by DAS. An individual who is or could be negatively impacted by the board action may also appeal to DAS for a review. If the process determines that the reviewable action is not subject to state or federal antitrust law, then DAS will approve the action in writing and the board action may take effect. If the reviewable action is deemed a potential violation of antitrust law, DAS will then disapprove of the action in writing.

## 2. Align Licensing and Regulatory Efforts with Modern Clinical Standards and Practices

The new medical professional licensing board structure is designed to update Ohio's antiquated system to one that is better aligned with modern clinical standards and practices. Additionally, barriers in the existing system will be removed, allowing new boards to better monitor and address potential professional misconduct. This realignment will achieve a net reduction of eight boards.

- Better Alignment for Nutrition and Respiratory Care:** The State Medical Board of Ohio will assume most work and oversight currently assigned to the Ohio Board of Dietetics and Ohio Respiratory Care Board, with the exception of licensing home medical equipment facilities. This change will add roughly 11,500 licensees to the State Medical Board of Ohio's existing number of approximately 81,000. The basic structure and appointed membership of the Medical Board will remain unchanged.

- Better Alignment for Home Medical Equipment Facilities:** The Ohio Board of Pharmacy will absorb the approval and monitoring of home medical equipment facility licensing – a responsibility currently within the purview of the Ohio Respiratory Care Board. This change will add fewer than 800 licensees to the Pharmacy Board's existing list of nearly 43,000. The basic structure and appointed membership of the Pharmacy Board will remain unchanged.

- Better Alignment for Physical Health Services Providers:** A new Physical Health Services Board will replace the State Board of Orthotics, Prosthetics and Pedorthics, and the Ohio Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Athletic Trainers Board. The proposed board moves from two independent

boards with a combined total of 29 appointed board members to a new board with seven appointed board members representing professionals from each former board.

The proposed board structure moves from three independent boards with a combined total of 37 appointed board members to one board with seven appointed board members representing professionals from each former board.

The proposed board structure moves from four independent boards with a combined total of 31 appointed board members to one board with nine appointed board members representing professionals from each former board.

- **Dental, Nursing and Chiropractic Boards Remain Unchanged:** While the Ohio State Dental Board, the Ohio Board of Nursing and the Ohio State Chiropractic Board will need to comply with the new level of rule review in an effort to prevent antitrust violations, these boards will not experience any structural changes as a result of this proposal.

**3. Reduce Bureaucracy to Shrink Government and Save Valuable Taxpayer Dollars**

As each board is restructured, duplicative layers of bureaucracy will be removed and taxpayer savings will be achieved by reducing costly administrative overhead. Additionally, the number of licensees monitored by each new board will be more comparable to Ohio’s larger, standalone licensing boards. While the exact dollar savings will not be known until compensation is set for appointed board members under the new structure, the number of those receiving taxpayer-funded compensation and benefits will be significantly reduced. However, this proposal simply redesigns how we manage licensing in Ohio and does not impact the number of licensees monitored or applications that will need to be reviewed. As such, we fully expect staffing needs and roles to remain largely unchanged under the new structure, allowing the high level of work currently being done by licensing and regulatory professionals within existing boards to be maintained under the new system.

**BOTTOM LINE:** Reforming Ohio’s medical professional licensing board structure will minimize legal vulnerabilities related to antitrust laws, align board licensing and regulation with modern clinical standards and practices, promote coordination to better detect and act upon professional misconduct, and create smaller, more efficient government to achieve taxpayer savings.
