

Call to Order

Linda Aller, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 10:35 a.m.

Approval of Minutes

James Adams moved to approve the July 25, 2012 meeting minutes as submitted. Laura Kramer Kuns seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Committee Reports

- There were no committee reports.

Executive Secretary Report

- Stephanie Youst informed the Board she mailed 64 RS and 20 SIT expiration notices on August 1, 2012.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that would be meeting with the Governor's office on September 14, 2012 regarding appointments to the Board.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that the budget for fiscal years 2014 and 2015 was due by September 17, 2012 to the Office of Budget & Management. The Board's budget was capped at 100% of their fiscal year 2013 appropriation, which was \$126,850.
- The formal written reports are attached to the minutes for reference.

Assistant Attorney General Report

 - Once the regulations change, which is expected to be sometime in December or later, registration as an RS or SIT will no longer be required to do manufactured home park inspections. Until the time the registrations become effective registration will still be required. This decision was made by the Ohio Department of Health legal counsel in conjunction with the Manufactured Homes Commission.
 - Local health departments will still be responsible for handling nuisance issues even if they have not entered into a contract or signed on with the new program.



Procedures and information: examination.

(A) Applicants for registered sanitarian shall pass an examination conducted by the board.

(1) Information concerning examination procedures is available and may be obtained at the office of the state board of sanitarian registration.

(2) Examinations shall be held at least one time each year and at more frequent intervals if the board deems this necessary. The board may limit the number of applicants at any examination to that which may be adequately and prudently accommodated and supervised.

(3) Examinations shall be held in central Ohio, and at such other places as may be determined by the board.

(4) Applicants for examination must either be registered as sanitarians-in-training or approved to take the examination by the board through submission of an application for registered sanitarian.

(5) The board shall charge separate fees for examination, provided that the fees are not in excess of the actual cost to the board of conducting the examinations.

(6) Applications for examination must be made on forms prescribed by the board. Each completed application must be accompanied by a check or money order payable in the manner prescribed by the board in the amount of the appropriate fee.

(7) An applicant shall be considered scheduled for an examination upon receipt by the board of the application. The examination fee shall not be returned after applicant is scheduled for examination.

~~(8) Applications for examination and the appropriate fee must be received by the board at least thirty-five days prior to the examination date.~~

(B) The board may require an examination for registration as a sanitarian-in-training and shall annually determine whether an examination shall be required.

(1) If the board requires an examination for registration as a sanitarian-in-training, the following procedures shall apply:

Type of examination.

The board shall provide a written examination which is objective and practical and meets the requirements of section 4736.09 of the Revised Code.

Sanitarian-in-training extension request.

- (A) A sanitarian-in-training shall apply for registration as a sanitarian within three years of registration as a sanitarian-in-training.

The board may extend the registration of any sanitarian-in-training who furnishes, in writing, sufficient cause for not applying for registration as a sanitarian within the three year period.

- (B) Sufficient cause for extending sanitarian-in-training registration will be determined by the board on a case by case basis. Sufficient cause for extension shall include but is not limited to:

(1) The sanitarian-in-training has taken the registration examination at least once, or;

(2) The sanitarian-in-training has competently performed for compensation, educational, investigational, technical or administrative duties in the field of environmental health science on or before the date of the extension request.

- (C) A sanitarian-in-training must be granted an extension of sanitarian-in-training certification prior to the issuance of the third annual registration renewal. Certificates of registration expire annually and become invalid on that date unless renewed pursuant to section 4736.11 of the Revised Code.

- (D) The extension request shall be written, and shall include:

(1) An explanation of why the requestor has not applied for registered sanitarian status.

(2) A listing of full-time experience from the date the sanitarian-in-training certificate was granted.

(3) The number of times the requestor has taken the registration examination.

- (E) A sanitarian-in-training who fails the registration examination on three or more occasions may be required, as part of the application process to retake the examination, to submit and show evidence of a study plan toward passing the registration examination, and/or meet such other requirements as may be imposed by the board.

Use of registered sanitarian and sanitarian-in-training designation.

- (A) The recipients of a certificate of registered sanitarian may use the appropriate registration designation following their name. The abbreviation "R.S." may be used in place of the words "Registered Sanitarian."
- (B) The recipients of a certificate of sanitarian-in-training may use the appropriate registration designation following their name. The abbreviation "S.I.T." may be used in place of the words "Sanitarian-in-Training."

4736-15-03

Practice limitation for sanitarian-in-training.

- (A) A sanitarian-in-training may engage in the practice of environmental health for a period not to exceed five years, provided the sanitarian-in-training is supervised by a registered sanitarian.

- (B) The five-year time limitation commences once the sanitarian-in-training begins to engage in the practice of environmental health full-time, part-time, or part-of-the-year and concludes five years from that date unless the sanitarian-in-training ceases to engage in the practice of environmental health during an entire renewal period.

I think the board should consider changing to the NEHA standard of 68%, not that I want to down play Ohio credentialing but I do think it would be easier to adopt their standard. Since new RS license holders would also be able to be REHS at the same time if they pay extra, is there a way to negotiate with NEHA that existing RS license holders can be REHS holders by just paying NEHA fees and not taking the test again?

To All Ohio Sanitarians and Sanitarians in Training:

The Ohio Sanitarian Registration Board, in order to keep all sanitarians informed, is hereby notifying you of a change in the Environmental Health Proficiency Examination requirements due to an action by the Professional Examination Service.

By letter dated May 21, 2012 Professional Examination Service (PES) will no longer support the Registered Sanitarian Examination program effective January 1, 2013. PES shall continue to provide examination booklets and scoring information through December 31, 2012. The Board will give the PES examination for the last time on November 13, 2012 in Pickerington, Ohio.

The only other known nationally recognized Environmental Health Proficiency Examination is conducted by the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) who gives a REHS/RS proficiency examination in relation to their RS Certification program. Preliminary contact has been made with them and it appears that they are willing to provide their exam to us in a similar method as PES has been doing without requiring NEHA membership or certification. The examination cost, once the switch is made to the NEHA examination, will be \$165. Section 747.10.10. (A) The Manufactured Homes Commission shall adopt the rules required by section 4781.26 of the Revised Code as amended by this act not later than December 1, 2012. After adopting the rules, the Commission immediately shall notify the Director of Health.

(B)(1) The rules governing manufactured home parks adopted by the Public Health Council under former section 3733.02 of the Revised Code shall remain in effect in a health district until the Commission adopts rules under section 4781.26 of the Revised Code as amended by this act.

(2) On the effective date of the rules adopted by the Commission as required by section 4781.26 of the Revised Code as amended by this act, the Public Health Council rules adopted under former section 3733.02 of the Revised Code cease to be effective within the jurisdiction of that board of health.

I also have some concerns about this. It seems like the OMHC is considering "privatizing" the inspection process by allowing a private contractor, not associated with a government regulatory authority, to perform compliance inspections. I would think that this would raise some constitutional questions about some of the essential functions of government relative to protection of health and safety. I am no legal authority, but I seem to recall that there is some case law relative to this issue that says in effect that government cannot delegate its regulatory authority to the private sector. It is an essential function that can only be done by government. This will bear some further analysis. We could initiate some legislative change that brings this back under the RS umbrella if needed.

There are other significant questions being raised about the administration of this program (licensing, method of reimbursement for inspection services at a local health department, and others) that may require some statutory language changes. Not sure if OEHA would take the lead on these changes. We could make sure that language is inserted that addresses the RS issue relative to inspections as part of some future fix it bill or as part of the upcoming budget bill.

This will be a good discussion for the Board.

Stephanie,

After its expiration, I was able to reinstate my RS, and I appreciate the extremely quick turnaround from the time I submitted the materials to your office. I did not intend to allow my registration to expire, and I failed in my responsibility to ensure that all of the necessary materials had reached your office. Although I will be diligent in the future, others may not, and as a result of my experience I have suggestion that may help make a similar, already bad situation not as troublesome for the sanitarian.

Given that it's necessary to place a sanitarian immediately on involuntary leave upon notification of an expired registration, the likely first option, unless the RS lives or works near your office, is to overnight the paperwork for processing the following day. If your office cannot process the application the day following notification the ex-RS is forced to drive a long distance to Columbus or take leave until the RS is reinstated.

Therefore, it is beneficial for the sanitarian to have the option of reinstatement the following day. I say this from a position of ignorance given that I know nothing about the business of your office. I only wish to offer perspective.
